About the University

The U.P. Pandit Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Pashu Chikitsa Vigyan Vishwavidyalaya Evam Go-Anusandhan Sansthan (DUVASU), Mathura, was established by the Government of Uttar Pradesh under U.P. Act No. 27 of 2001 on 25 October 2001, by carving out the College of Veterinary Science and Animal Husbandry from the erstwhile Chandra Shekhar Azad University of Agriculture and Technology, Kanpur.

DUVASU is named after the visionary statesman Pandit Deen Dayal Upadhyaya, who hailed from the Mathura region and who propounded the philosophy of Integral Humanism. He held that advances in science and technology should be directed towards uplifting the economy of rural India and the farming community, and was a champion of natural-resource management in crop and animal husbandry.

The mandate of the University is to (a) impart quality education in veterinary and allied sciences, (b) undertake need-based and basic research, and (c) provide extension services that carry research findings and knowledge to farmers and livestock owners. The University is spread over 782.34 acres at Mathura Cantonment, with an additional agricultural research farm of about 1,400 acres at Madhuri Kund.

The University comprises five constituent academic institutions — the College of Veterinary Science and Animal Husbandry, the College of Biotechnology, the College of Dairy Science, the College of Fisheries Science, and the Institute of Para-Veterinary Science — offering undergraduate, postgraduate, doctoral and diploma programmes in veterinary and allied sciences. DUVASU promotes scientific livestock production, animal health, dairy development, fisheries, biotechnology, conservation of indigenous cattle, and the transfer of modern technologies to rural communities, through academic programmes including the B.V.Sc. & A.H., M.V.Sc., Ph.D., B.Tech. (Biotechnology), M.Tech./M.Sc. (Biotechnology), B.Tech. (Dairy Technology), B.F.Sc., M.F.Sc., Diploma in Veterinary Pharmacy, Diploma in Livestock Extension, and other specialised courses designed to produce competent veterinarians, scientists and technical professionals.

The University provides excellent infrastructure and campus facilities to support academics and student life. The campus includes the University Library, Nand Bhawan, the Referral Super-Speciality Veterinary Hospital (Kothari Hospital), a health centre, three guest houses, hostels, a gymnasium, a helipad, a bank with ATM facilities, a post office, a primary school, a medical shop, a canteen, residential colonies, a herbal garden and a children's park for recreation. It also maintains a Livestock Farm Complex, the Go-Anusandhan Sansthan, a horse stable with a riding field, a goat farm, a poultry farm and agricultural farms, providing extensive practical training and research opportunities for students — facilities that make DUVASU one of the leading veterinary universities in India.

Graduate placement is an important benchmark of institutional success, and over the past five academic sessions, DUVASU graduates have achieved a strong record of placement across State animal husbandry departments, banks, the private sector, R&D and academic institutes, administrative services, the Remount Veterinary Corps, and paramilitary forces such as the BSF and ITBP. In recent years, graduates have increasingly launched their own start-ups — particularly small-animal clinics — becoming job providers rather than job seekers, and have performed strongly in the ICAR All-India Joint Entrance Examination for postgraduate scholarships and Junior Research Fellowships.

The University holds Memoranda of Understanding with national partners including CIRG (Makhdoom), IVRI (Izatnagar), NDRI (Karnal), NRC-Meat (Hyderabad), NIAH (Baghpat), RAJUVAS (Bikaner), the Central Council for Research in Homeopathy, CSWRI (Avikanagar), Sanskriti University (Mathura), IARI (New Delhi), NDVSU (Jabalpur), and ICAR-CARI (Izatnagar) — as well as international partners Oklahoma State University (USA), Purdue University (USA), and the International Training Centre on Pig Husbandry (Lipa City, Philippines) — broadening research and educational opportunities for students.

College of Veterinary Science and Animal Husbandry

The College of Veterinary Science and Animal Husbandry, Mathura, was established by the Government of Uttar Pradesh on 16 January 1947 in the Braj region of Mathura. It is one of the oldest and most prestigious veterinary colleges in India, holding the distinction of being the first veterinary college in Asia to start a degree programme in Veterinary Science (B.V.Sc.). It also pioneered M.V.Sc./M.Sc. programmes in 1951 and Ph.D. programmes in 1953 in various disciplines of veterinary and animal sciences. After the establishment of the U.P. Pandit Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Pashu Chikitsa Vigyan Vishwavidyalaya Evam Go-Anusandhan Sansthan (DUVASU), the College became its first constituent college and has continued to be the flagship institution of the University. The College of Veterinary Science and Animal Husbandry is among India's premier veterinary institutions, recognised for excellence in veterinary education, research, extension and animal healthcare.

The College currently offers three academic programmes: the Bachelor of Veterinary Science and Animal Husbandry (B.V.Sc. & A.H.), a 5½-year professional degree under the Minimum Standards of Veterinary Education (MSVE) Regulations, 2016; the Master of Veterinary Science (M.V.Sc.), a minimum four-semester postgraduate programme under ICAR BSMA-2021 Regulations; and the Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D.), a minimum six-semester doctoral programme under the same Regulations. It has 20 well-equipped teaching departments, a Central Instrumentation Laboratory, a Veterinary Clinical Complex (Kothari Veterinary Hospital) for the diagnosis and treatment of animals, and a Livestock Farm Complex that provides hands-on practical training to students. Emergency veterinary services are also provided round-the-clock for livestock and pet owners. Since its establishment, the College has produced highly skilled veterinary graduates, postgraduates and doctoral scholars, and generated research of national and international significance; its alumni hold prestigious positions across India and abroad as academicians, researchers, scientists, policymakers, consultants, entrepreneurs and administrators.

The Veterinary Clinical Complex (VCC) functions as a super-speciality teaching hospital, offering diagnostic, therapeutic, surgical, obstetric and preventive care for livestock, companion animals and other species — providing hands-on clinical training to students while delivering round-the-clock emergency and referral services. The Livestock Farm Complex houses more than 750 indigenous cattle, Murrah and Nili-Ravi buffaloes, a Goat Research and Training Centre with over 400 animals representing ten breeds, a Poultry Farm maintaining more than 3,000 birds, a Horse Stable with a dedicated riding arena, and an Agriculture Farm that supports teaching, research and extension activities.

The College maintains excellent infrastructure to support academics and student welfare, including modern classrooms, laboratories, museums, a central library, seminar halls, hostels for boys and girls, sports facilities, a gymnasium, and computer and internet facilities.

Student Amenities

Sports & Recreation

A large playground in front of the main building supports outdoor games such as cricket, hockey, football, volleyball, lawn tennis, kabaddi and kho-kho, while a gymnasium, badminton hall and squash court cater to indoor fitness and recreation. An annual sports meet and cultural programme is held alongside regular debates, declamations, quizzes, essay-writing competitions and cultural events.

Academic & Digital Infrastructure

An Agricultural Knowledge Management Unit (AKMU) connects all University departments and offices through a campus-wide LAN. Four state-of-the-art virtual classrooms — each equipped with an Interactive Flat Panel Display, digital podium, document camera, high-definition camera, audio system and high-speed internet — support live lectures, video conferencing, webinars and virtual practical demonstrations. All departmental seminar halls carry similar smart-teaching facilities for seminars, workshops and faculty development programmes.

Cafeteria & Canteen

Cafeteria and canteen facilities are available on campus for the convenience of students and staff.

Bank & Post Office

An Indian Overseas Bank branch with ATM facility and a Sub-Post Office are located on the main campus, with an additional State Bank of India ATM at the University's main gate.

University Library

Housed in a three-storeyed building, the University Library holds an extensive collection of Indian and foreign journals and books, with photocopying and internet-enabled computers, and remains open from 10:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. daily. A separate book bank offers additional support to students from weaker sections of society.

Student Welfare

The Student Welfare office attends to students' basic amenities and supports personality development and leadership training, with particular emphasis on discipline. Students actively participate in the management of hostels, mess facilities, games and sports, and cultural and literary activities.

Hostels

Nine well-ventilated hostels — six for men and three for women — offer Wi-Fi connectivity, common rooms with television, newspapers and magazines, indoor games such as table tennis and carrom, and mess facilities. Hostels are managed by wardens under the supervision of the Dean, Student Welfare, with allotment subject to availability.

University Health Centre and Cooperative Shop

The University Health Centre provides students, staff and their families with basic medical consultation, first-aid and emergency care, with qualified medical staff available on campus. A Cooperative Shop adjoining the campus supplies stationery, provisions and other daily essentials to students and residents at reasonable, subsidised rates.

Post Graduate Diploma Programmes (Hybrid Mode)

The College of Veterinary Science and Animal Husbandry offers two Post Graduate Diploma Programmes — in Animal Welfare and in Veterinary Ayurveda — designed for practising veterinary graduates seeking specialised, practice-oriented knowledge through a hybrid mode of instruction combining distance learning with mandatory on-campus practical training.

Admission Procedure

1. Number of Seats — The total intake for each Post Graduate Diploma Programme is thirty (30) seats.
2. Mode of Application — Applications shall be submitted **OFFLINE**, in the format prescribed in this Prospectus (see 'Application Form' below). The duly completed form, together with self-attested copies of all requisite certificates/mark-sheets and proof of payment of the application fee, must reach the Office of the Registrar, DUVASU, Mathura – 281001, on or before the closing date notified for the respective programme.
3. Routes of Admission — Seats are filled through two routes, as detailed below.
 - a) Nomination: primarily, seats are filled through nomination of eligible Veterinary Graduates (holding a B.V.Sc. & A.H. degree recognised by the Veterinary Council of India) employed in Government/statutory bodies, sponsored through the prescribed official channel by the concerned State or Central Government/organisation.
 - b) Direct (Merit-Based) Application: open to eligible Veterinary Graduates, as per VCI norms, who apply directly.

Any seat not filled through the nomination route shall be made available for filling through the Direct (Merit-Based) route, and vice versa, in accordance with the University's admission rules then in force.
4. Selection Criteria — Admission is made from among registered Veterinary Graduates strictly on merit, determined by the percentage of marks obtained in the B.V.Sc. & A.H. degree, as per VCI norms. This merit basis applies equally to candidates seeking admission through nomination and through direct application. In the event two or more candidates obtain an equal percentage of marks, preference shall be given to the candidate senior in age; should the tie still persist, the candidate shall be ranked as per the University's applicable tie-breaking norms then in force.
5. Fee Remittance — The application processing fee of Rs. 1,000/- (non-refundable) and, upon selection, the requisite semester fee must be remitted through NEFT/RTGS/Bank Transfer to the account specified under 'Fee Remittance Details' on page 3, and the transaction receipt enclosed with the application.
6. Application Timeline — Opening Date: **25 September 2026**; Closing Date: **31 October 2026**. Candidates are advised to visit www.upvetuniv.edu.in for the schedule of scrutiny, merit preparation and counselling.
7. Reservation Policy — The reservation policy of the Government of Uttar Pradesh, as applicable from time to time, is followed for admissions against sanctioned seats. Any seat reserved for a

particular category that remains unfilled for want of eligible candidates in that category shall be dealt with in accordance with the reservation policy of the Government of Uttar Pradesh and the applicable rules of the University for this programme, as in force at the relevant time.

8. Minimum Enrolment for Commencement — A Post Graduate Diploma Programme will be conducted only if a minimum of **15 (fifteen)** seats are filled. Should the minimum application not be reached by the closing date, the programme will not be conducted for that session, and the course/semester fee, if already deposited, shall be refunded to the enrolled candidates as per the bank account details provided by the applicant, along with a written request to the Registrar, DUVASU, Mathura. The non-refundable application processing fee shall not be refunded in such cases.

General Provisions

- i. Any seat remaining vacant after the prescribed procedure is exhausted will be dealt with as per the applicable rules and regulations of the University authorities.
- ii. All admissions are subject to verification of eligibility, documents and fulfilment of statutory requirements.

Course Duration and Pattern (36 Credits)

- i. Duration: one academic year, divided into two semesters.
- ii. Mode: primarily distance-learning, delivered through the University's approved online learning platform and conducted with the requisite statutory/academic approvals of the University's Academic Council, with a mandatory 15-day contact class programme / hands-on training at DUVASU, Mathura, at the end of each semester.
- iii. Working days: each semester comprises 105 instructional days.
- iv. Theory (distance-learning mode): lectures delivered via a robust online platform.
- v. Practical (in-person): one mandatory 15-day contact classroom-cum-intensive practical session at the end of each semester at DUVASU, Mathura.
- vi. Content delivery: a learner-centric approach supported by printed Self-Learning Materials (SLMs), prepared by subject experts and structured into 5–6 units with review questions, alongside a semester-wise academic schedule and timely assignment submission.

Academic Regulations and Examination Pattern

Medium of Instruction and Duration

The medium of instruction is English, under the semester system. The academic year comprises two semesters, per the academic calendar notified by the University.

Semesters lost on account of withdrawal, voluntary dropping out, failure to register in time, medical grounds, use of unfair means, or any other reason are counted towards the maximum permissible duration. A student who does not complete the programme within the maximum time limit will no longer be enrolled, and no diploma will be awarded.

Enrolment, Registration and Continuance

Admitted and continuing students must present themselves in person at the institute at the start of each semester, on dates notified by the University. On successful deposit of the admission fee, the student is issued an Enrolment Number by the Office of the Registrar, which must be used for all future academic correspondence. Registration for the first semester is completed in person as part of the admission procedure; registration in subsequent semesters follows the same process on dates notified by the Registrar/Dean, College of Veterinary Science & A.H.

Candidates sponsored by an organisation must submit a No Objection Certificate (NOC) from the sponsoring organisation at the time of physical reporting/admission, failing which admission may be cancelled. A continuing student who misses the scheduled registration day may register within the following six working days on payment of a late registration fee of Rs. 250/- per day; failure to register within this window results in denial of registration for that semester. Registration may be suspended or cancelled by the Vice-Chancellor in cases of indiscipline, misconduct or unauthorised absence, in which case the student is graded as failed for that semester. A minimum of 75% attendance is required to be eligible for the semester examination, calculated separately for (a) online theory teaching, based on participation logged on the online learning platform; (b) timely submission of the prescribed assignments; and (c) the mandatory on-campus practical/contact session at DUVASU, Mathura.

Examination Pattern

1. An end-semester examination comprising theory and practical components is held at the end of each semester, with assessment placing greater emphasis on practical competence. This end-semester examination is distinct from the internal assessment (assignments) described below. The theory examination is conducted by the Controller of Examinations (COE), DUVASU, on a date-sheet notified in advance.
2. The theory paper comprises 40% objective and 60% subjective content, of two hours' duration, evaluated on a 10-point scale.
3. Practical examinations are conducted in the concerned department by the course teachers, immediately following the theory examination as per the notified date-sheet. There is no make-up examination for any missed semester examination.
4. At least one assignment per course must be completed each semester. Marks are distributed as Assignment 20 + End-Semester Examination 80 = Total 100, for both theory and practical components.

5. Answer books are evaluated by internal examiners and shown to the concerned student; the results shall be submitted to the COE within seven days of the examination.

Passing Criteria, Grading and Result

A minimum of 60% marks (excluding assignment marks) is required to pass a course, secured separately in each of the theory and practical examinations; in addition, a candidate must secure a minimum aggregate of 60% marks inclusive of assignment marks. Failing either requirement, the student must repeat the course in a subsequent semester. There is no provision for grace marks under any circumstances. Grade Point is calculated on a ten-point scale, and the Overall Grade Point Average (OGPA) is the total credit points earned divided by the total credit hours across all semesters.

Only re-totalling of marks is permitted; no re-evaluation or re-examination of answer scripts is allowed. The COE declares the final result within 15 days of receiving the last examination result and issues a Composite Academic Transcript on completion of the course. Thereafter, the Dean, College of Veterinary Science & A.H., issues the Character Certificate once the No-Dues Certificate has been obtained.

Application Procedure

1. Candidates must fill in the Google Form giving accurate personal, academic and contact details, and select the certificate course(s) they wish to apply for, in order of preference. A single application fee permits a candidate to apply for more than one Certificate Course, and the stated order of preference is binding for the purpose of allotment; however, simultaneous admission to more than

one Certificate Course is not permitted, and a selected candidate must exercise a single choice at the time of admission.

2. Scanned copies of all required documents — High School and Intermediate mark-sheets and certificates, the qualifying degree/certificate relevant to the chosen course (e.g., B.V.Sc. & A.H. degree certificate for the Veterinary Diagnostic Imaging course), and proof of payment of the application fee — must be uploaded along with the form.
3. The non-refundable application fee (Rs. 500/-) must be paid before submitting the form, and the transaction details entered in the space provided.
4. Applications must be submitted before the last date notified for the respective course; incomplete applications, or those received after the closing date, will not be considered.

Selection Criteria

Selection of candidates for each Certificate Course is made on merit, ranked by the percentage of marks obtained in the qualifying examination, subject to the candidate possessing at least the minimum qualification prescribed for that course (e.g., 10th Pass, 12th Pass, or B.V.Sc. & A.H., as specified in the table above). In the event of a tie in the percentage of marks, preference shall be given to the candidate senior in age.

Candidates are advised to complete and submit their application, along with the required documents and fee payment, well before the closing date. The University reserves the right to reject any application that does not meet the prescribed eligibility criteria.
